HS 817 SQUADRON

MOTTO: AUDE FACERE - I Dare To Do

First formed in the Royal Navy in 1941, and operated Albacore aircraft in the Anti-Submarine role in Icelandic waters and the Mediterranean. In 1943 the squadron reformed with Barracudas and carried out operations in Sumatra and the Nicobar area before disbanding in 1945.

Recommissioned as an RAN squadron with Fairey Firefly aircraft in 1950, and whilst embarked in HMAS SYDNEY, served with distinction in the Korean conflict. In 1955 the squadron disbanded and reformed with Fairey Gannet aircraft until disbanding again in 1958.

HS 817 recommissioned in 1963 with the Westland Wessex Mk. 31A helicopter which was updated to the Mk. 31B in 1968.

SEA KING Mk. 50

The Westland Sea King is an advanced twin-engined helicopter primarily intended for all weather operations in the Anti-Submarine and Search and Rescue roles, but can be used for a large variety of other tasks.

Installed equipment includes tactical radar, medium range sonar and an advanced automatic flight control system, as well as comprehensive navigation and communication equipment.
